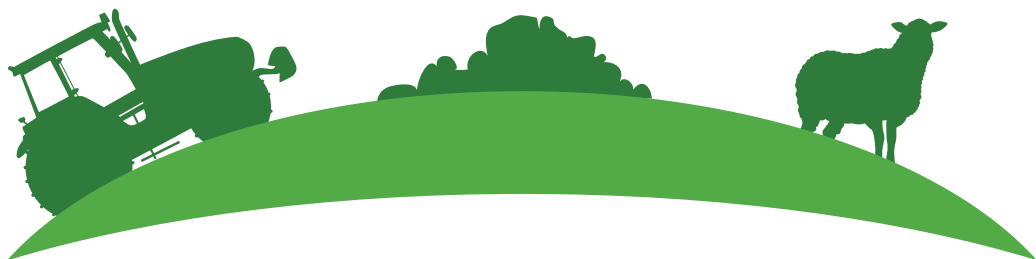

ENTRY RULES - FLOWER & PRODUCE SHOW

Classes are open to all exhibitors

Please read the rules and schedule carefully

- All exhibits (excluding the floral art classes) must have been grown or made by the exhibitor and have not been previously entered in the show.
- The entry fee is 50p per entry. 10 entries or more gives you free entrance to the show.
- All entries, accompanied by entrance fees, must be made in writing to: Mrs Aileen Sherer, The Old Brickyard, Lower Brailes, OX15 5AF on Thursday 7th August by 7pm. What3Words: ///dolly.unwind.vase For your convenience Baldwin News and The Forge Garage, Lower Brailes have also kindly agreed to accept entry forms.
- Each named entrant must be on a separate entry form in sealed envelopes with the correct fee. Please state age if in the children's section
- NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.
- Any exhibitor may enter more than one exhibit in any class but shall not take more than one monetary prize in that class except where stated.
- Exhibits must be staged on the morning of the show between 8.30am and 10.45am, when the marquee is cleared for judging. The committee will not be responsible for any loss or damage.
- The judges may call in any assistance they require and their decision in all cases is final.
- If there are insufficient entries in any one class one or more prizes may be withheld. The judges are not obliged to award prizes where they think they are not merited.
- The Marquee will open to the public at 1.30pm and close after presentation of the cups.
- No exhibit is to be removed before the completion of the cup presentation at 4pm.
- All exhibits must be removed at the end of the show and before 5pm.
- Prize money is to be collected between 2.00pm and 4.30pm from the Treasurer. Any prize money not collected will be a donation to the show
- The points for judging will be awarded as follows:
- All classes: 1st: 3 points, 2nd: 2 points, 3rd: 1 point
- In the event of a tie for a cup, the award will go to the exhibitor with the most 1st prizes.

- 53** 2 x 1lb jars of set honey (*any granulated type incl. soft set*)
- 54** 2 x 1lb jars of clear honey (*any colour*)
- 55** 6 jars of honey (*any size or type*) labelled as for sale
- 56** 1 frame of honey ready for extraction or 1 square section or 1 round or 2 containers of cut comb
- 57** 1 other hive product containing honey or beeswax e.g. polish, fudge, soap, lip balm etc.

Fun Dog Show

Saturday 9th August | Brailes Playing Field

I'm very happy to be running the **Fun Dog Show** again this year as part of the Brailes Village Show - and this time, we're really putting the *fun* back into it!

After last year's brilliant turnout (some classes had over 50 dogs!), we're capping entries at **25 dogs per class** so things run more smoothly, everyone gets their moment to shine and we can make it home in time for dinner. We're also excited to welcome a **panel of guest judges**, including a representative from **StreetVet**, a wonderful charity we're supporting this year. They provide free vet care and are working to create **pet-friendly shelters** so people experiencing homelessness don't have to choose between a bed for the night and their beloved companion.

This is a day for smiles, waggy tails, and community spirit and not to be taken all too seriously. Whether your dog's a trickster, a total chaos gremlin, or just there for the sausages, there's a class for everyone:

This Year's Classes:

- 1. Junior Handler** (*Children under 12*) - A short obedience routine for our juniors to show off their training and great connection with their dog.
- 2. Best Trick** - Any trick goes!
- 3. Musical Sits** - Like musical chairs, but the dogs must sit when the music stops!
- 4. Egg and Spoon Race** - Lead and egg in the same hand - what could go wrong?
- 5. Best in Show** - Finalists from each class compete for the grand title
- 6. Temptation Alley** - A none judged class just for fun and for you and your dog to enjoy!

One thing that really struck me last year was how keen especially the youngest of handlers were to show off their training with their dogs. So this year, Junior Handlers need to perform a short obedience routine. **Here's what we'll ask them to do:**

- Walk up and introduce yourself and your dog to the judges
- Weaving through cones on a loose lead
- Ask your dog to sit and wait while you step back, then return
- A short recall (we'll hold the lead!)
- Show off a trick or special move to finish!

I share this so our Juniors can practice before the big day. We'll be looking for teamwork and enthusiasm, not perfection ;-)

We really hope you'll come along, join in, and make this a joyful celebration of dogs, kids, and community. See you there!
